The syllabus of the M.A. programme is designed by the Postgraduate Board of Studies in Political Science.



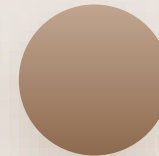

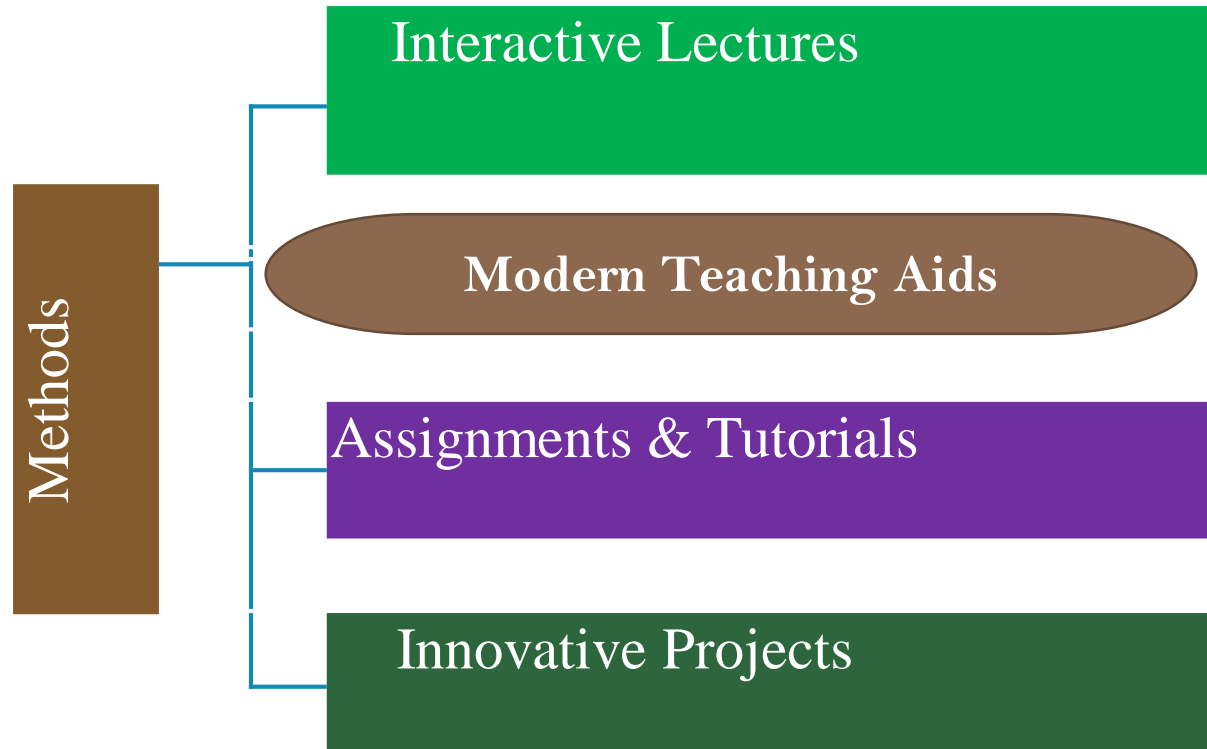
Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

Teaching-Learning: Key Features

- Teaching is a core strength of the Department and faculty is deeply invested in promoting a culture of innovative and participatory pedagogy.
- Active faculty engagement in research, conferences, and Faculty Development Programs.
- Classrooms are Wi-fi enabled and fitted with Smart boards.
- The Department regularly provides photocopies of some primary texts to the students. In addition, teachers share handouts and soft copies and e-content of both primary and secondary material.
- Regular tutorials for clearing doubts and enhancing one to one interaction between teachers and students
- In order to include a practical component, a course on “Research Methodology and Term Paper” was introduced in Sem IV (Batch 2022).
- The Department has One academic and One career counsellor who guide students during admissions.



Criterion II: Teaching & Learning Process



Student Evaluation and Faculty Assessment

- Internal Assessment examination divided into three segments—Assignment, Class Room presentation and attendance.
- 75% attendance is mandatory for a student to sit for the end-semester examination.
- Fair evaluation: Integrity ensured; re-evaluation policy as per university guidelines.
- Final Submission of Assessment (both Internal and End Semester) Award rolls after full satisfaction of the student.



Faculty Assessment

- The Department mandates the students to register their feedback with the DIQA to help the University to take corrective measures wherever required.
- The Department has developed its own feedback seeking mechanism wherein the Head of the Department interacts with the students and inquires about the quality and availability of the teaching and non teaching facilities.
- To redress the grievances of students one faculty member is designated as Coordinator of the Grievance Cell.
- Fortnightly meetings are held with the Class representatives to incorporate their genuine suggestions with regard to functioning of the Department.

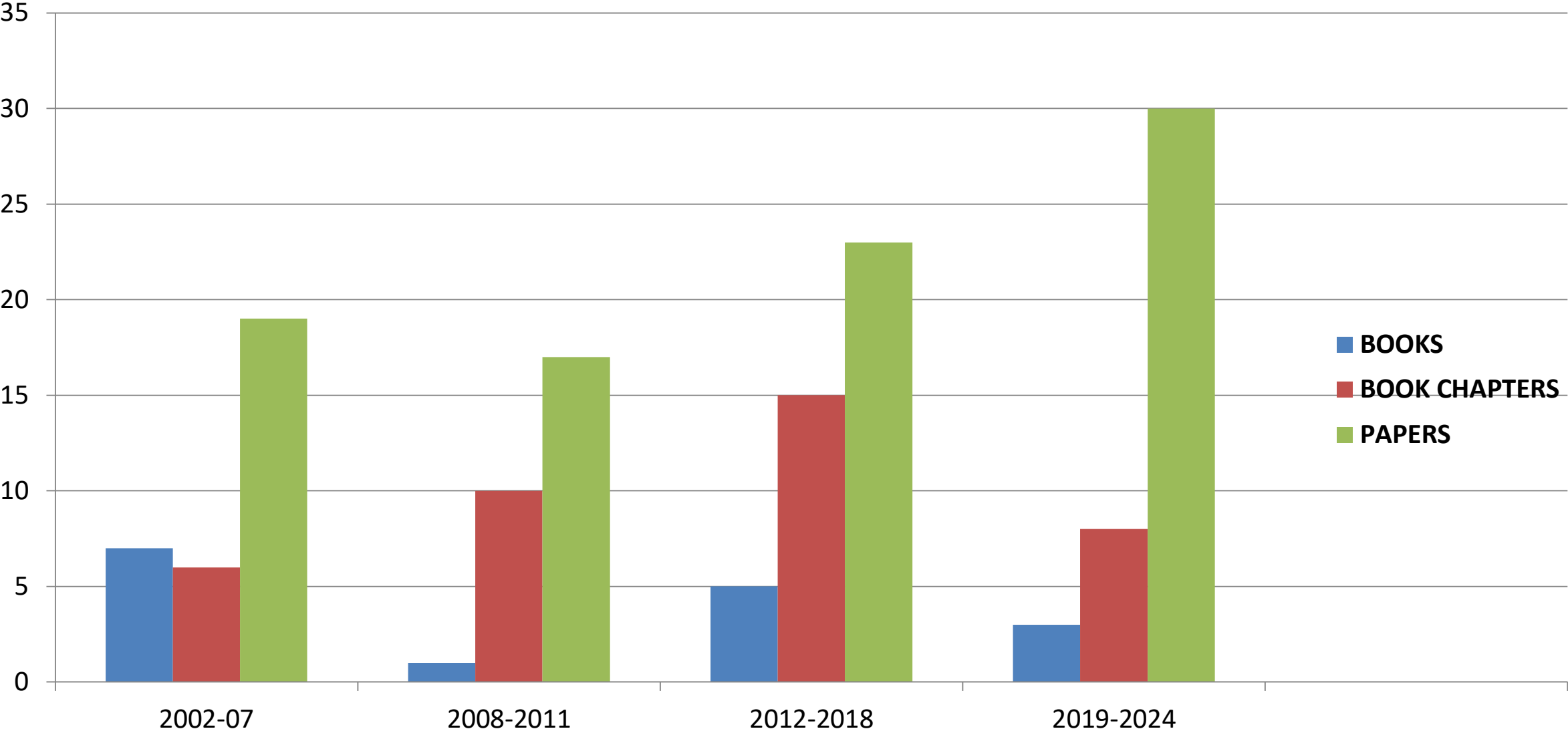

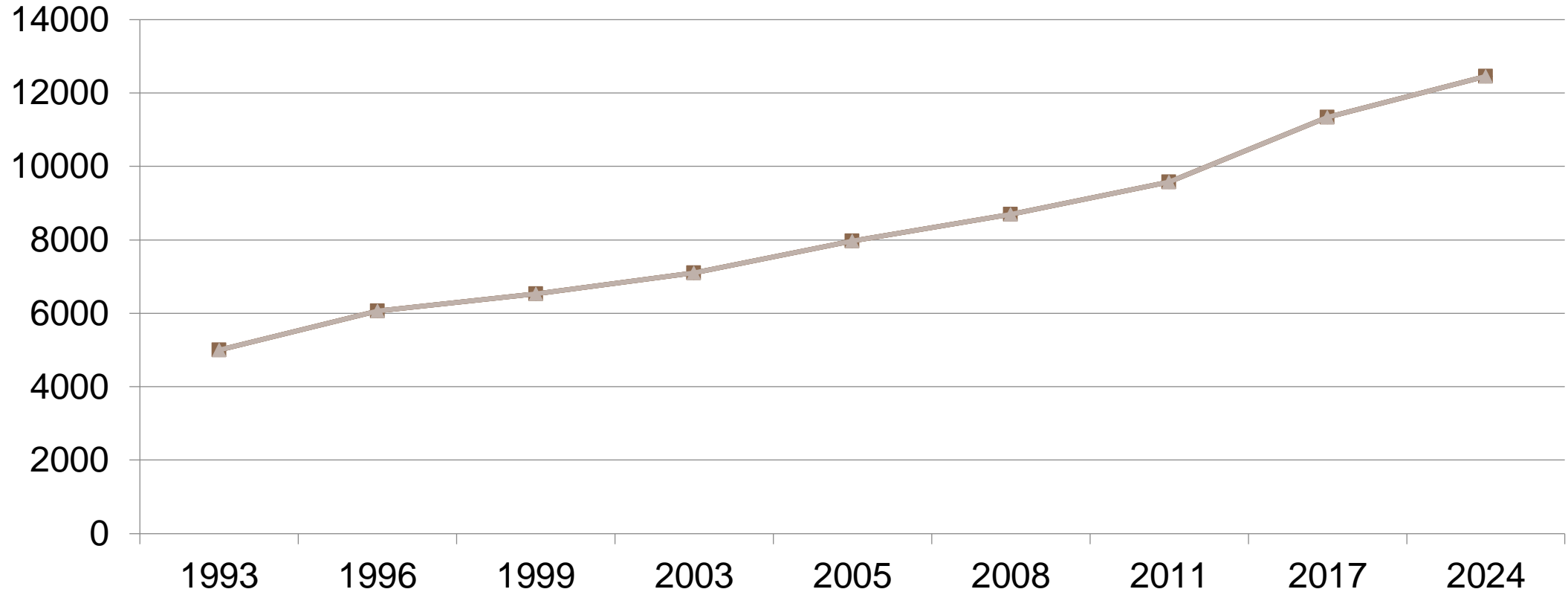

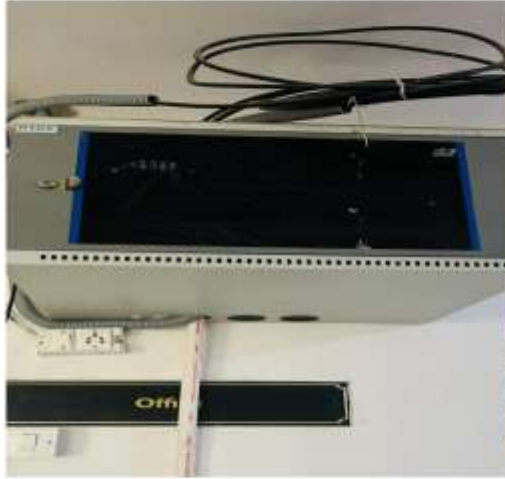

- **Automated library system:** Students can avail of the departmental library facilities during working hours.



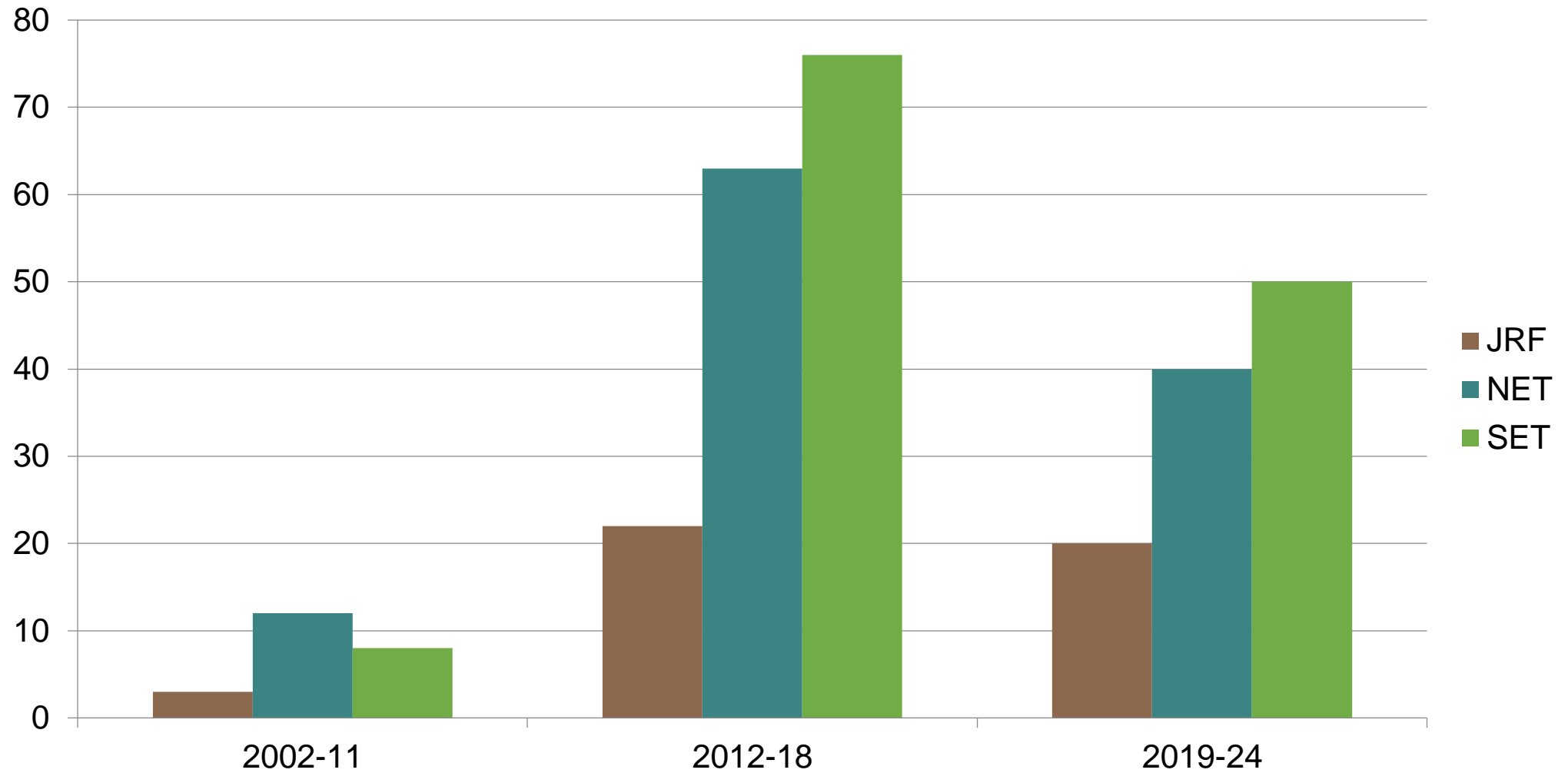

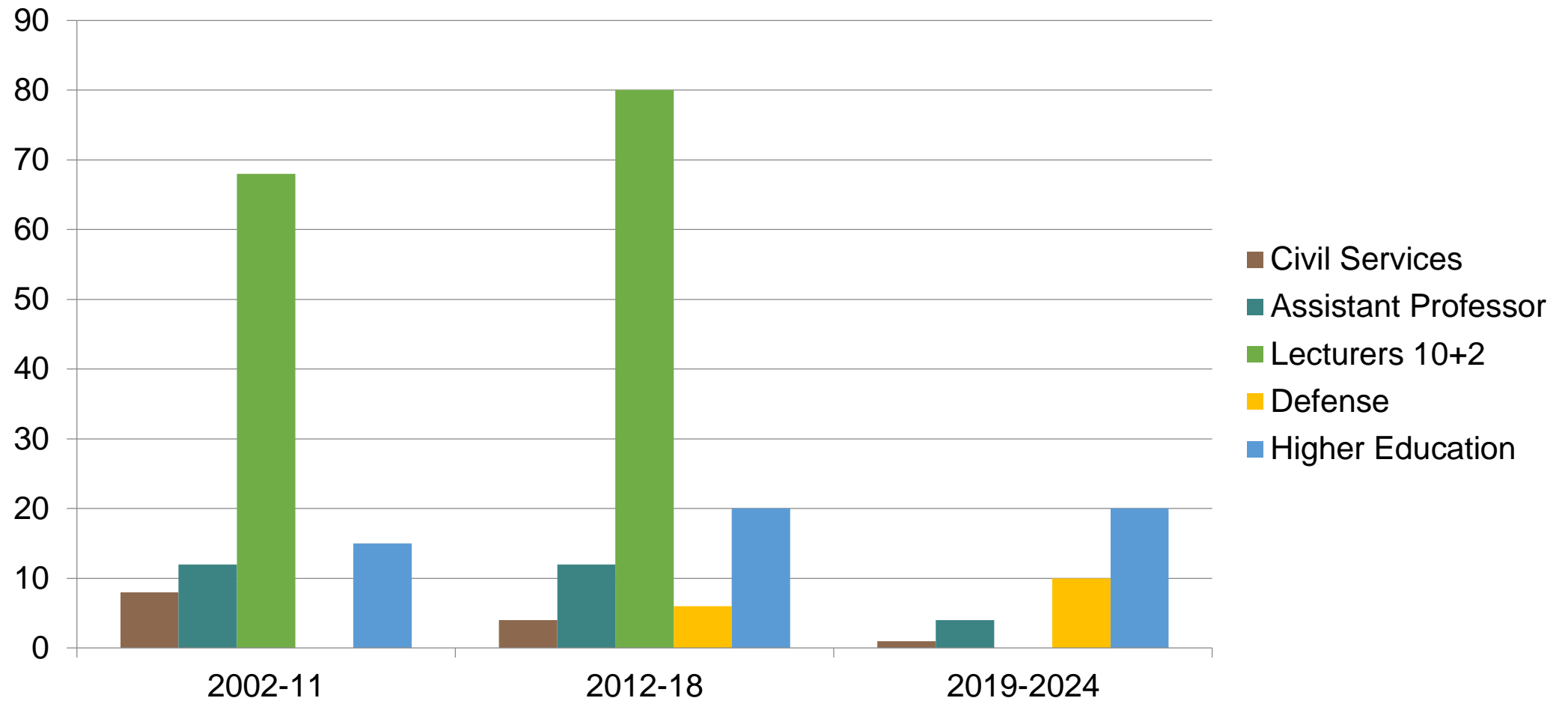
